**Institut Polytechnique de Paris announces the appointment of Robbert Dijkgraaf, former minister and world-renowned physicist, as Chair of its International Scientific Advisory Board (ISAB)**



**Palaiseau, January 6, 2026** – Institut Polytechnique de Paris is pleased to announce the appointment of **Robbert Dijkgraaf** as the **new Chair of its International Scientific Advisory Board (ISAB)**. A distinguished mathematical physicist and internationally recognized academic leader, Mr. Dijkgraaf succeeds Patrick Aebischer, former President of EPFL (Switzerland).

Institut Polytechnique de Paris wishes to express its deep gratitude to Patrick Aebischer for his driving role. His commitment helped place excellence and international openness at the heart of the project from its very first years.

This appointment is part of the momentum launched in July 2024 through a new governance framework, designed to support the development of IP Paris and reinforce its ambition to become a world-class institute of science and technology.

### **A standout figure for a world-class ambition**

**Former Minister of Education, Culture and Science of the Netherlands**, Robbert Dijkgraaf brings to the ISAB a rare combination of cutting-edge research expertise and high-level public governance experience. Currently **Distinguished Professor at the University of Amsterdam and President-elect of the International Science Council (ISC)**, he led the prestigious **Institute for Advanced Study (IAS)** in Princeton for ten years.

His work on string theory and black holes, as well as his experience leading the Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences, make him a prominent figure in the global scientific community. **Honored with the Spinoza Prize and the title of Knight of the Order of the Netherlands Lion**, he is also recognized for his communication skills and his ability to bring the voice of science to the public sphere.
